16 Whereas, HIV non-occupational post exposure prophylaxis (nPEP) is a critical
17 treatment prevention strategy for HIV exposure necessary for victims of sexual
18 assault or other non-occupational HIV exposures with the potential to reduce but not
19 altogether eliminate the possibility of becoming infected with HIV, and
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21 Whereas, anyone experiencing a high risk exposure should seek medical
22 attention as there is no cure for HIV infection or AIDS which makes this preventive
23 strategy all the more important in an attempt to avert this life altering condition post
24 non-occupational exposure, and
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26 Whereas, per the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) nPEP
27 Guidelinesⁱ - the use of antiretroviral drugs [Tenofovir+ Emtricitabine* plus either
28 Raltegravir or Dolutegravir (*Lamivudine may be substituted for Emtricitabine)]
29 immediately after a non-occupational exposure to HIV –from sexual assault or other
30 risk exposures– to prevent infection from taking hold in the body. The combination of
31 three antiretroviral drugs is recommended within 72 hours of exposure and is to be
32 taken daily for 28 days, and
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34 Whereas, appropriate nPEP intervention is recommended to decrease the
35 likelihood of transmission if administered within the first 72 hours post exposure. The
36 role of HIV prevention therapy is to eliminate the potential for HIV sero-conversion in
37 the exposed victim, and
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39 Whereas, there is risk for varying treatment interpretations/discrepancies
40 involving victims of sexual assault post exposure that place them at higher risk for
41 developing life altering HIV infection as clinicians in clinics, and other health care
42 delivery facilities work to better understand the updated nPEP CDC
43 recommendations, and

45 Whereas, any deviation from the CDC recommended guidelines and standard
46 for care for nPEP places the victim as greater risk for HIV sero-conversion, and
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48 Whereas, both Macomb and Wayne County Medical Societies strongly urge
49 that the Michigan State Medical Society work with the Michigan Department of

50 Community Health to adopt and implement standardized state-wide, HIV nPEP
51 guidelines based on current New York state guidelinesⁱⁱ while awaiting the
52 recommendations of the CDC; therefore be it

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54 RESOLVED: That MSMS urge the Michigan Department of Community Health
55 to utilize current New York state guidelines on HIV nPEP to develop and implement
56 standardized HIV nPEP recommendations for use throughout Michigan as the
57 “Standard of Care” for the treatment of victims of sexual assault and other non-
58 occupational exposures to HIV infection.
