Whereas, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention declared an opioid epidemic in the US, and

Whereas, sales of opioid prescription medications in the US have quadrupled since 1999, and

Whereas, in 52 percent of the overdose deaths in the state of Michigan involving prescription opioids, the antecedent had a prescription for the drug of first mention filled within 30 days prior to their death, and

Whereas, the State of Michigan is in the top quartile for opioid prescriptions written per person, and

Whereas, Michigan is joining 42 other States with its implementation of a new Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP) in April 2017, and

Whereas, Michigan’s PDMP is, in part, funded by licensing fees, and

Whereas, Michigan’s PDMP is updated every 24 hours, and

Whereas, Michigan’s PDMP is already legislated to include Schedule II, III, IV and V medications; therefore be it

RESOLVED: That MSMS seek legislation requiring the reporting of Naloxone dispensing to Michigan’s Prescription Drug Monitoring Program, including pharmacies that dispense this medication without a physician’s prescription.
